To continue creating impact in the communities in Kenya, FOTV launched Fruits Planting in schools in 2015. The program allows Alumni or friends to choose a school or church or community of their choice and support them to grow fruits seedlings in partnership with FOTV.

Funding the project is done through efforts of approaching the Kenyan Diaspora living in the United States, asking them to give back to their native country– (Kenya), Annual Dinner and other donation people make through M-PESA Pay Bill # 480552. You can too donate as low as Ksh 120 for one mango seedling.

The first time to launch the program was in 2015 across 16 different schools in various counties, with over 700 seedlings

The second time saw over 1500 seedlings donated to 27 schools between June and August 2016.

In 2017, a donation of 1300 seedling to 34 schools across 6 counties (Baringo, Nandi, Elgeyo Marakwet, Uasin Gishu, Bomet and Kericho).

In 2018, another launch takes place in Molosirwe Primary School, Mogotio Sub-County in Baringo County on May 14, 2018, where 400 mango seedlings will be donated to 20 schools.

During the launch, a Survival Rate Log book is issued to the schools to assist in tracking the performance of the mango plans for the next five years.
